The Sonnegg is a family run youth hotel, just a 10 minute walk from the Schönleiten ski lifts, so guests walk to the slopes in the morning.

The Sonnegg offers a very good standard of accommodation for school groups. PGL has built up an excellent relationship with the Fresacher and Bichler families through many years of working together, and these friendly hoteliers provide a very warm welcome to our groups.

Rooms are large and recently refurbished with 4-6 bunks in each. There is one spacious 8-bedded room. All rooms are en suite.

Groups should bring their own towels.

Skiing in Saalbach information

The neighbouring villages of Saalbach and Hinterglemm have always been PGL's most popular Austrian destination, offering over 200km of pistes, covering a range to suit any level of skier.

A superb lift system covers both sides of the Glemm Valley; it can be skied in either direction with the added bonus of a free shuttle bus operating during the day along the Saalbach – Hinterglemm road. Furthermore, the area boasts some of the most reliable snow conditions in the country.

Intermediates will enjoy the beautiful tree-lined pistes on both sides of the valley, and the open snowfields above Hinterglemm. Meanwhile, for beginners the nursery slopes are close to both village centres, with a range of good, easy runs higher up.
